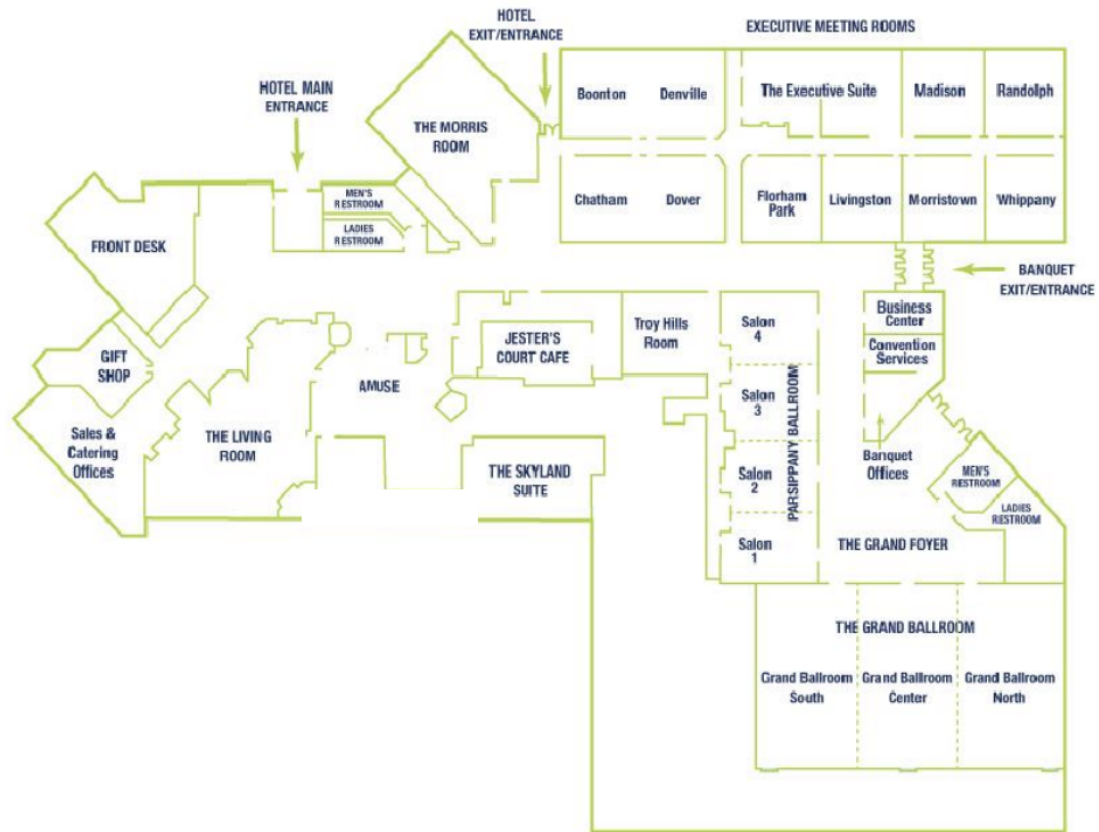

GUIDELINES & SAMPLE RESOLUTION

Please **handwrite** your clauses and submit them to the dais, per your chair's directions. **Prewriting** any clauses is strictly prohibited at PMUNC.

Additionally, **Large Language Models** (such as ChatGPT, Gemini, Claude, etc.) are strictly prohibited for drafting position papers, speeches, and resolution clauses. While delegates may use AI as a research tool to brainstorm or locate information, **LLMs cannot be listed as a source in your bibliography, and you must verify and cite authentic sources.**

Unless otherwise noted, all motions require a simple majority of 50% + 1 to pass. In order to be introduced, a draft resolution must have at least 2 sponsors, and 20% of the committee must be either a sponsor or a signatory.

SAMPLE RESOLUTION

Sponsors: [Countries who wrote and fully support this resolution]

Signatories: [Countries who want to see this resolution introduced to the floor and voted upon; they do not necessarily have to support all of the resolution's statements]

Topic: "Writing a working paper in committee"

Draft Resolution 1.1

The General Assembly,

Declaring this resolution to be a sample of how delegates should write their working papers in committee,

Affirming the use of Preambulatory clauses to formally introduce the topics in mind, reference specific previous UN action, or to point towards past regional or global efforts on the topic,

Bearing in mind that the starting phrase cannot be italicized by hand, but each clause should still end with a comma and have proper spacing,

1. Proclaims that operative clauses state specific actions desired by the committee;
2. Designates that the first word of the clause be underlined and each clause end in a semi-colon;
3. Further proclaims that if subclauses are to be used:
 - a. The sub- clause ends with a comma and are denoted with letters rather than numbers,
 - b. They can have sub-sub clauses, which:
 - i. Further expand upon on a statement in a subclause,
 - ii. Are denoted by Roman Numerals,
 - iii. Have at least 2;
4. Calls upon all delegates to not bring pre-written clauses to committee, but write their papers together with fellow delegates;
5. Reminds delegates that they cannot use computers to type their working paper;
6. Encourages all delegates to have a fantastic weekend writing working papers and debating resolutions at PMUNC 2026

REFERENCE GUIDE: RULES OF PROCEDURE

Adoption of the Agenda	2+/2-	Majority	Sets the order of topics to be discussed
Set Time Limit	None	Majority	Establishes or sets limit on each speech
Move into Moderated Caucus	None	Majority	Moves the committee into a moderated caucus for the stated purpose under the stated time constraints
Move into Unmoderated Caucus	None	Majority	Moves the committee into an unmoderated caucus for the given amount of time
Table the Topic	1+/1-	Majority	Ends debate on the current topic without voting on resolutions
Close the Debate	2+/2-	2/3	Ends debate on the topic and moves into voting procedures
Divide the Question	2+/2-	Majority	Splits a resolution in order to vote on parts of it separately
Declare an Important Question	2+/2-	Majority	Requires a substantive issue to need 2/3 majority to pass
Roll Call Vote	None	None	Requires the chair to record a verbal vote of yes, yes with rights, no, no with rights, abstain, or pass from all delegations individually

Working Paper	Requires a minimum of one sponsor and signatures of 20% of countries present. Requires a simple majority to pass, unless deemed an important question.		
Resolution	A working paper which has been formally introduced to the committee. A resolution passes if more than 50% of the active votes are "Yes"/in favor.		
Friendly Amendment	Must be agreed to by all sponsors of a resolution. Once approved, it becomes automatically incorporated into the paper.		

AWARDS POLICY

The following four tiers of awards may be given at PMUNC 2026 for each committee:

1. Best Delegate
2. Outstanding Delegate
3. Honorable Mention
4. Verbal Commendations

In addition, a “Best Position Paper” award will be given.

The following tiers of awards may be given at PMUNC 2026 for delegations:

1. Best Delegation
2. Outstanding Delegation

Awards will be given on the basis of the following criteria, in no particular order:

- Adherence to policy of country/character
- Attendance in all committee sessions*
- Public speaking ability
- Ability to negotiate, compromise, and form effective agreements
- Knowledge of the subject material
- Knowledge and proper application of the Rules and Procedure
- Professional and mature conduct
- Adherence to the PMUNC policies (attendance, dress code, etc.)

*Note: Crisis delegates not staying at the Dolce Hotel by Wyndham Parsippany Hotel will **NOT** be penalized for missing unlisted sessions.

In addition to the committee awards, four school awards will be given for the first and second place schools in both large and small school categories. The school awards will be based on a variety of factors, including the school’s overall performance and conduct, delegation size, and the overall effort put into the Conference.

DELEGATION AWARDS

The following tiers of awards may be given at PMUNC 2026 for delegations:

- Best Small Delegation
- Outstanding Small Delegation

- Best Large Delegation
 - Outstanding Large Delegation

A total of four delegation awards will be presented at PMUNC 2026: two for small delegations and two for large delegations. Awards will be given to the delegations that have achieved the highest total number of awards based on a weighted point system. The tallying system is described below:

- Best Delegate (6 pts)
- Outstanding Delegate (4 pts)
- Honorable Mention (3 pts)
- Verbal Commendations (2 pts)
- Best Position Paper (1 pts) **small delegations are delegations have 15 delegates or less, large delegations are delegations with 16 delegates or more*
